This is the translation of the Eleventh article in this series.

With Faith in His Feet, and His Name on Our Lips

Govindanukku Aatpatta Kudumbamamma #12



(Generally, there would be a 'vision document' for an organization. The head of the organization would create that document. Periodically, the organization's status would be made known through a 'status report'.

This madhurageetham graced by Sri Swamiji feels like the 'vision' of the worldwide family beholden to our Govinda. Not only that, this madhurageetham also represents the permanent 'status' of us all, who live happily and peacefully by Guru-Hari's grace.

Here is a nectarine interpretation!

It is said that if we combine the first word and the final word in the works of mahans, we will obtain the entire essence of that grantha. Here is the final verse of this madhurageetham:

sOmbi thiriyavum mATTOm, vambu pEsavum mATTOm

Lazily wander, we shall not; gossip, we shall never!

With faith in His feet and the Name on our lips, we shall live ever!

The madhurageetham began with the phrase "illaratthil irundhiDuvOm" (We shall live in the household) and now completes with "nAmam solli vAzhndhiDuvOm" (We shall live with the Divine Name on our lips).

This shows beautifully that the status of our family that is beholden to Govinda (Govindanukku aatpatta kudumbam) is that "We shall live in the household happily with the Divine Name on our lips".

These nine verses illustrate that if we live without running away from responsibilities and with the Divine Name constantly on our lips, other divine qualities will themselves come to us.

Once when our Guru Maharaj was speaking of the charitram of Sri Narada, he quoted what Srimad Bhagavatam says about how Sage Narada lived after obtaining Bhagavan's darshan.

nAmAnyanantasya hatatrapah paThanguhyAni bhadrANi krutAni cha smaran |gAm paryaTamstushTamanA gataspruhah kAlam praTlkshanvimado vimatsarah ||

The families beholden to Govinda are no less!

Chanting the names of the limitless Govinda without hesitation; thinking always of His rupa (form), gunas (divine qualities), and leelas (sports/actions); fulfilling our duties and commands cheerfully; we live with a contented mind without pride or jealousy. The final verse of our madhurageetham beautifully extracts the essence of Bhagavata dharma.

We shall live (vAzhndhiDuvom) by staying away from tamasic lethargy and aimless wandering, eliminating rajasic gossip and discussions, keeping

staunch faith towards the sattvic Govinda's feet, and constantly chanting Govinda's Divine Names which are no different from Him, which is the final fruit of life. Thus indicating that we have attained the true purpose of life, this is how this madhurageetham culminates.

We are living peacefully in the shelter of a Guru's feet. The world is going on its own course. But it does not affect us. How immense is our fortune? Apart from singing this madhurageetham again and again; melting in wonder while thinking again and again of our immense fortune; prostrating again and again to our Guru Maharaj's lotus feet, what else do we need to do? And what else can we do?

Ananthakoti namaskarams to our Guru Maharaj and Sri Premikavaradan on behalf of all of us who are Govindanukku aatpatta kudumbam!



Why is Krishna Blue? Sri Ramuji explains....

The sky and ocean, which are vast and beautiful, are colorless, but appear blue. They are infinite. They are powerful. They are too large for the human mind to comprehend. They come from a source that is infinite and beyond name and form. That which is infinite and beyond name and form, when it takes a name and form, appears blue.

Scientifically it is proven that blue light has more energy than red light which is why the photoelectric effect is observed only with blue light. Although the blue light has a lot of energy and is more powerful when we see the sky or the ocean which are blue, we feel calm, quiet and there is silence in our minds. When the mind sees something grand, it quietens.

It is documented that even people who follow religions other than Sanatana Dharma have seen a blue light while having spiritual experiences. This goes to show that the divinity of the blue is not limited to Hindu religion. It is also said that even if we have never seen or heard of Krishna when we chant Mahamantra, we will experience the brilliance of the blue light. Some meditation classes suggest imagining a blue light or blue dot to calm the mind.

Blue is such a special color. Many people enjoy looking at the sky and the ocean because it is calming. It makes people happy. Blue is also the most powerful color in the spectrum. Krishna chose to be blue since blue is beautiful, grand, great, calming, powerful, peaceful, and represents things that are vast and infinite. And the color blue has all of these qualities because Krishna chose to be blue.



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SRI MADHURAGEETHAM QUELISH – A Vedantic and Rasa-Filled Prayer

We shall relish, little by little, the rasa in Sri Madhurageethams, compositions of HH Maharanyam Sri Sri Muralidhara Swamiji, in the form of 'questions to relish', which we call as a 'quelish', as shared by his disciple Sri Ramanujamji.

The entire gamut of bhakti has been expressed as a beautiful vast ocean in Sri Madhurageethams. There are five main bhakti bhavas in Bhakti Shastra and Sri Madhurageethams can be categorized under each of these five bhavas. This month we shall journey one such Madhurageetham which is an outpouring of Shanta Bhakti and also enjoy the rasa of sweet silence that this Madhurageetham reveals.

Our 'question to relish' (quelish) is — Which Sri Madhurageetham shows Bhagavan Sri Krishna a perfect resting place for Him and Sri Swamiji assures him that he would not reveal His place to anyone as "he can't!" and why is that he can't?

"One, whose mind always rests in silence, is truly a Jnani.", says Bhagavan Sri Ramana Maharshi. When the mind is agitated it is 'avidya', when the mind is silent, attentive and filled with divine love, it is 'vidya' and 'vidya' is 'jnanam'.

Sri Swamiji, in a beautiful Madhurageetham, "solla solla paRakkudaDA – nam pAvam ellAm – hari nAmam" which glorifies the greatness of singing the divine names elaborates on this sweet silence. He says, "The mind which keeps moving hither and thither slowly on its own accord is silenced when chanted (thuLLat thuLLa ADiDum manam thAnE thAnE aDangudaDA)". The mind thus abides in silence – in its own source, in Sri Krishna Charanam and envelopes one in never-ending waves of bliss (aLLa aLLak kuRaiyAda Anandam thAnE perugudaDA).

So, when the mind is united with Krishna it blissfully drowns in dynamic silence. Our Sri Swamiji in the Madhurageetham, "Angum Ingum OdAthey Kanna" also, highlights this silence in the last line of the song. He is inviting Bhagavan Sri Krishna to come to Him and unite with his mind (pAngAgavE en pangil vandiDuvAy en manadil sangamitthiDuvAyE). So this results in a state which transcends speech and thought. Hence Sri Swamiji says, there is no

risk of revealing Bhagavan (solliDuvEn enDra bhayam vENDAm) thus answering the question of the quelish as to why Sri Swamiji cannot and will not reveal Bhagavan Sri Krishna!

This kirtan exudes the fragrance of Shanta Bhakti. The paths of Jnana and Shanta Bhakti, while very similar, are yet noticeably different. The end result of both paths is the realization of Bhagavan Sri Krishna as the Inner Self. The path of Shanta Bhakti, in addition, is decorated with various bhavas.

In Srimad Bhagavatam, the Gopis, the very epitome of prema bhakti, in their Gopika Geetham extoll the Lord also as the indwelling witness in the hearts of all embodied souls ("akhila dEhinAm anthar Athma dhrukh"). Many spiritual giants and saints of India have been both great jnanis and rasikas. Their works have been renowned treatises that encompass and embrace both these grand paths. Sri Jayadevar's Geetha Govindam gives the highest Vedanta as expounded by the Upanishads interwoven and embellished with supreme rasa. The 22nd octet of Geetha Govindam (which we call as the kalyana ashtapathi) starting with "harim eka-rasam chiram abhilashitavilAsam" is considered the crown jewel of all. This octet talks about that universal truth, that Brahmam as Bhagavan Sri Krishna sitting and gracefully sporting in the dense groves of Brindavan. Sri Madhusoodhana Saraswathi a great scholar par excellence and a master in Advaita Shastra, in one of his lovely nectarine works states, "KrishnAtparam kimapi tatvam aham na jAne" - "I do not know of a truth higher than Bhagavan Sri Krishna, whose hand is adorned with the flute, who wears the yellow silk garment, whose lips are bright red as the bimba fruit, whose countenance is attractive, shimmering like the full moon and whose eyes are like that of the lotus." The great Avatharapurusha Sri Adi Shankara Bhagavathpada, proponent of the Advaitha philosophy, in His Govindashtakam says, "that, 'sathyam jnAnam anantham brahmam' is verily Bhagavan Sri Gopalan."

Our Sri Swamiji too in this kirtan, 'AnguM Ingum OdAmal', very lucidly portrays this highest state of oneness and the supreme rasa both on the same plane. The last line of this kirtan perfectly fits this quelish where in Sri Swamiji pacifies Bhagavan Sri Krishna that he would not reveal His presence to anyone and hence, He need not fear (sollaRa nilaiyenakku varumAdalAl solliDuvEn enDra bhayam vENDAm) as this-is, a silence-state ever!

Another lovey Sri Madhurageetham, "Acchiyar pOtrum AnaikkuttiyE..." (which is sung during dolotsavam) also conveys the same bhava where Sri Swamiji ends the song by singing lullaby to Bhagavan calling Him to come and rest in his heart!(ULathil vandiduvAy thAlEIO).

Let us now enjoy the lyrics and meaning of this Sri Madhurageetham 'Angum Ingum OdAmal' set in Raga Sama and Adi Tala.
